		<p>F40 <i>D. Waverley Delight</i> x <i>D. teretifolium</i> 'Shane'</p> <p><i>D. Waverley Delight</i> has wonderful shape and is of burnt orange and sunset tones. <i>D. teretifolium</i> 'Shane' is a fine example of the species with its cream flowers, larger than normal. Hopefully these flower with lots of colour and lots of large flowers.</p> <p>Available in 50mm @ \$8 & 80mm @ \$15</p>
		<p>G43 <i>D. Tweetas</i> 'Neville' x <i>D. Martin</i> 'Gold' HCC/AOC</p> <p>This is one cross I personally have very high hopes for. <i>D. Tweetas</i> 'Neville' has excellent shape and colour, paired here with the 'beefy' <i>D. Martin</i> 'Gold'. We are looking for colourful yellows and oranges with outstanding shape. There's no experimentation with this cross, just on a hunt for award quality progeny.</p> <p>Available in 50mm @ \$8 & 80mm @ \$15</p>
		<p>JD1313 <i>D. Australian Ginger</i> 'Golly' FCC/AOC-ANOS x <i>D. teretifolium</i> var. <i>aureum</i> 'JD Gold'</p> <p>Another from our southern friend Jeanne Dunn, whose hybridisation is nothing short of outstanding. This is a reverse of 2833 and its parents are actually very similar. These should be a large flower, packed with colour and thanks to the influence of <i>D. striolatum</i> the plants shouldn't grow meters long!</p> <p>Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>
		<p>2977 <i>D. Australian Ginger</i> 'Wow' HCC/ANOS-AOC AD/AOC x <i>D. Kalon Byrne-Dimos</i> 'Newbold'</p> <p>Again, large and colourful flowers are expected. However, we are hoping to maintain the quality shape and proportioned nature of the clear yellow 'Newbold'. The ginger used in this cross might not have the best shape of the grex, but what it does have is colour.</p> <p>Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>
		<p>2978 <i>D. Tweetas</i> 'Curly Gold' x <i>D. Wickersham</i> 'Genesis'</p> <p>The next generation of yellow hybrids here, looking for purple tones in the labellum and full shape. We used 'Curly Gold' because of its floriferousness and also compact growth habit. 'Genesis' is of course the product of <i>D. Lauren</i> 'Holly Chief' AM/AOC</p> <p>Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>
		<p>2989 <i>D. Harmon</i> 'Mark' x <i>D. Hot Coals</i></p> <p>Our mushroom pinkish-brown <i>Harmon</i> is a relatively large <i>Dendrobium</i>, its white striations and its 30mm plus wide bloom really stand out in spring. It's a very compact plant and its inflorescences are completely upright. We used <i>D. Hot Coals</i> to hopefully inject a fair amount of its brown and red colouration, just for something a bit different.</p> <p>Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>
		<p>3011 <i>D. Tweetie</i> 'Huge' x <i>D. Australian Ginger</i> 'Big Guy'</p> <p>Searching for big and colourful flowers similar to <i>D. Tweetas</i>, however this time with an extra dose of <i>D. fuliginosum</i>. 'Big Guy' is our largest ginger and has an awesome ruffled labellum. These should be good.</p> <p>Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>












		<p>3012 <i>D. Tweetie 'Pie'</i> x <i>D. Martin 'Gold'</i> HCC/AOC</p> <p>The 'beefy' <i>D. Martin 'Gold'</i> has very good shape and it also has an interesting mix of green and gold tones. Here we have match him with 'Pie' to try and achieve a different colouration. Also, by using <i>D. Tweetie</i> there is a chance we will get more than one flowering a year. These should be plants for the show bench.</p> <p>Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>
		<p>3013 <i>D. Sharday</i> = <i>D. chordiforme</i> 'Tumbi' x <i>D. Tweetie 'Pie'</i></p> <p>The reason I made this cross was to begin a line of breeding, a line of compact plants that flower in the later months of the year, this way we have section rhizobium hybrids in flower all year round. We expect quality shape and colours ranging from yellow to red.</p> <p>Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>
		<p>3015 <i>D. Martin 'Gold'</i> HCC/AOC x <i>D. Tweetie 'Pie'</i></p> <p>A reverse of the above 3012, grab one of each and see which has the most colour!</p> <p>Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>

Two of our awarded show winners paired together, these should be outstanding.</p> <p>Available in 50mm @ \$10</p>











		<p>3131 <i>D. Martin 'Gold'</i> HCC/AOC x <i>D. Tamara 'JD Spots'</i></p> <p>The 'beefy' <i>D. Martin 'Gold'</i> has very good shape and it also has an interesting mix of green and gold tones. So, we've paired him with our favourite <i>D. Tamara</i> to add some spotting and improve his labellum and overall shape. Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>
		<p>3121 <i>D. teretifolium var. aureum 'Gigantor'</i> HCC/AOC x <i>D. Tweetas 'Cork Gold'</i></p> <p>We love 'Cork Gold' but it is a slightly smaller flower with a lighter count. So, we have added 'Gigantor' to the mix with its massive blooms and an average of 9 flowers per inflorescence. We have also learnt that 'Gigantor' intensifies colour, with our cross <i>D. Hunter Legend</i>. Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>
		<p>3151 <i>D. Martin 'Royal'</i> x <i>D. Tamara 'JD Spots'</i></p> <p>On the search for spots here. Both parents are large and shapely flowers on compact plants. Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>

Harmon 'Mark'</i> x <i>D. striolatum 'Ruffles'</i> FCC/AOC</p> <p>Our mushroom pinkish-brown Harmon is a relatively large <i>Dendrobium</i>, its white striations and its 30mm plus wide bloom really stand out in spring. It's a very compact plant and its inflorescences are completely upright. I thought it would be good to introduce <i>D. striolatum</i> to increase floriferousness, create compact bushy plants and increase our percentage of pinks or maybe even greys. 		<p>3157 <i>D. Tweetas 'Red Lip'</i> x <i>D. Kalon Byrne-Dimos 'Newbold'</i></p> <p>'Red Lip' has done fantastic things in breeding. However, I have been a little hesitant due to its tendency to reflex just a little. Recent progeny have not had this trait. So, we paired it with 'Newbold' to increase size, shape and hopefully carry through that lovely red labellum. Available in 50mm @ \$10</p>
		<p>3120 <i>D. teretifolium var. aureum 'Gigantor'</i> HCC/AOC x <i>D. Martin 'Royal'</i></p> <p>Similar to cross 3121. We have added 'Gigantor' to the mix with its massive blooms and an average of 9 flowers per inflorescence. We have also learnt that 'Gigantor' intensifies colour, with our cross <i>D. Hunter Legend</i>. Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>

		3127 <i>D. Tweetas</i> 'Old Gold' x <i>D. Grey Ghost</i> 'Tumbi' AM/AOC-ANOS Probably my favourite cross in the 2019 catalogue. I'm really excited about the colour prospects of this cross as it could potentially unlock a brand-new colour or combination. We have seen <i>D. Grey Ghost</i> do this before, creating stunning blue wash colours. Both plants are compact, floriferous, have great colour and great shape. Available in 50mm @ \$10
		2971 <i>D. teretifolium</i> var. <i>teretifolium</i> 'Bega' x 'Buddha' A cross of a white <i>D. teretifolium</i> given to us by the late Brian Abbott with 'Bega' our largest white! This particular clone has very thick terete leaves and large flowers. The more of this beautiful species we can make available, the less they might 'disappear' from nature. Will grow best mounted on hardwood or cork. Available in 50mm @ \$8
		JC1000 <i>D. striolatum</i> 'Alba Packer's' x 'Tassie Gold' This cross was made by Jody Cutajar. We have a few excess plants so thought we would make them available as everyone loves a good <i>D. striolatum</i> . These will be varying intensities of yellow, maybe a few albas. 






		G52 <i>D. Bergen</i> 'Melissa' x <i>D. Zip</i> 'JMCM' We have been struggling to get germination with this spectacular <i>D. Bergen</i> , so I gave in and put the ever-fruitful <i>D. Zip</i> on to 'Melissa'. I guess this is seen as a stepping stone hybrid but the results should be some heavily patterned white flowers that are very strong growers. 3% <i>bigibbum</i> Available in 50mm @ \$8
		G57 <i>D. Burgundy Bride</i> 'Dell' x <i>D. Sunglow</i> 'Tumbi' 'Dell' hosts a bold burgundy labellum matched by maroon patterning on the segments and this labellum seems to carry through into its progeny. Therefore, we paired it with our best <i>D. Sunglow</i> which is known to let colour through. Maybe just maybe we will see some yellows with red labellum's. 6.3% <i>bigibbum</i> Available in 50mm @ \$8
		G61 <i>D. Gillieston Jazz</i> 'Fishing Point' x <i>D. Finale</i> 'Chunks' We are trying to gain intensity of colour, substance and ease of growth in this cross. The vibrant pinks and purples of 'Fishing Point' would look better on a yellow background and improvements to shape are always a bonus. 12.5% <i>bigibbum</i> Available in 50mm @ \$8







		<p>G73 <i>D. Jonathan's Glory</i> 'Dark Joy' HCC/AOC x <i>D. Zip</i> 'JMCM'</p> <p>There is no doubt we are looking for stripes and lots of them. There's nothing better than a compact plant that flowers its head off every spring and this is just what this cross will do. They may not be award winners but they will be colourful. 6.3% <i>bigibbum</i> Available in 50mm @\$8</p>
		<p>F61 <i>D. Jayden</i> = <i>D. Elegant Heart</i> 'Sundowner' x <i>D. speciosum</i> 'Top Shelf'</p> <p>Bernie Fletcher has remade <i>D. Jayden</i> for us, using a particular <i>D. Elegant Heart</i> which is absolutely massive in size and which carries an equally impressive labellum. It's not often you see quality remakes of this hybrid done by someone of Bernie's calibre. 12.5% <i>bigibbum</i> Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>
		<p>G62 <i>D. Gillieston Jazz</i> 'Fishing Point' x <i>D. Zip</i> 'JMCM'</p> <p>We know <i>D. Zip</i> should not be under estimated just yet, it has this magic ability to give us fantastic striping. The vibrant pinks and purples of 'Fishing Point' would be superior if they were more defined and improvements to shape are always a bonus. 12.5% <i>bigibbum</i> Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>
		<p>G66 <i>D. Touch of Class</i> 'Dark' x <i>D. King-Wong</i> 'Striker' AD/ANOS</p> <p>As Tropicool Dendrobium breeding become more complex, I believe it is crucial to reintroduce vigorous and easily grown hybrids or species. The late Norm Mitchell gifted me this piece of 'Striker' and I thought thing new mum would take a liking. I am hoping to see dark and large flowers on compact and vigorous plants. 6.3% <i>bigibbum</i> Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>
		<p>G56 <i>D. Burgundy Bride</i> 'Dell' x <i>D. Finale</i> 'Chunks'</p> <p>'Dell' hosts a bold burgundy labellum matched by maroon patterning on the segments and this labellum seems to carry through into its progeny. Therefore, we paired it with our best <i>D. Finale</i> which is known to let colour through. Maybe just maybe we will see some yellows with red labellum's. 6.3% <i>bigibbum</i> Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>
		<p>G50 <i>D. Don't Forget</i> 'I Love You' x <i>D. Hunter Titanium</i> 'Jazzy'</p> <p>Mum is <i>D. Burgundy Bride</i> 'Dell' x <i>D. spec. v. spec.</i> 'Windermere', so the colour genes are there. They may not be award winners but they will be colourful. 6.3% <i>bigibbum</i></p> <p>Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>

Jesmond Charm</i> 'Abbey' HCC/AOC</p> <p>Again, I wanted to produce a line of hybrid that really grew well and flowered well, as I felt there was a gap in quality work that fulfilled this brief. Well, it seems that there are not many mature plants of this cross around and as David said "The flowers of 'Dell' had an attractive dark edging but most striking (in the mind of this tooth-picker) was the gorgeous full purple labellum which I was sure would be reproduced in its progeny".
